Patients attending the evening cataract clinic will undergo full assessment and testing for cataracts, followed by a comprehensive consultation with experienced cataract surgeon Dr Lei Liu about treatment options.

If recommended, cataract treatment involves keyhole surgery to remove the cloudy lens, which is then replaced with an artificial lens. Cataract surgery is the most common eye surgery performed in the world and has a high success rate. We offer both standard and laser cataract surgery and often help patients get rid of their reading glasses by using the latest lens products.

Our clinic is co-located with Vision Day Surgery Eastern – fully equipped with state-of-the-art technology – meaning cataract surgery can be performed on-site for your convenience.
