## Prof Colin Chan

MBBS(HONS) MPHIL FRANZCO

**Professor Colin Chan is an internationally recognised expert in vision correction procedures, including laser eye surgery (LASIK, SMILE®, SMILE pro and ASLA/PRK), refractive lens exchange and laser cataract surgery.**

Prof Chan is an Adjunct Professor at the University of Canberra, a Clinical Associate Professor at the University of Sydney and an Adjunct Associate Professor at the Chinese University of Hong Kong. He is the Academic Coordinator for The Fundamentals in Laser Eye Surgery Courses and the Postgraduate Ophthalmology Continuing Professional Education Courses at the University of Sydney. Prof Chan is also the Asia-Pacific Academy of Ophthalmology (APAO) Regional Secretary for Australia and New Zealand.

### BACKGROUND

Prof Chan received his Bachelor of Medicine and Surgery with Honours from the University of Melbourne and went on to complete his internship and residency at St Vincent's Hospital in Melbourne. He then undertook specialist ophthalmology training at the Royal Victorian Eye and Ear Hospital and the Sydney Eye Hospital. This was followed by a sub-specialty fellowship in corneal and laser eye surgery at the Boxer Wachler Vision Institute in Beverly Hills and the University of California in Irvine (USA). It was during his fellowship training that he became one of the first surgeons in the world to perform collagen cross-linking to treat keratoconus. He has since been amongst the first surgeons in the world to perform laser cataract surgery and was one of the first surgeons in Sydney to perform SMILE® laser eye surgery.

Prof Chan is heavily involved in education and research. He is on multiple committees at the Royal Australian and New Zealand College of Ophthalmologists (RANZCO), such as the RANZCO Selection Board and the Continuing Professional Development (CPD) committee.

Prof Chan has participated as an investigator and medical monitor in 20 clinical trials and published 50 peer-reviewed articles in medical journals. He has a Web of Science H index of 17, with 50 Publications and 978 Sum of Times Cited. Prof Chan is a Future Vision Foundation Grant Recipient. His publication 'Effect of inferior-segment Intacs with and without C3R on keratoconus' is one of the top 100 cited articles in the field of keratoconus. He was awarded a scholarship for his Master of Philosophy research into medical student selection at the Sydney Medical School, University of Sydney.

Prof Chan is the Convenor for the Asia-Pacific Academy of Ophthalmology (APAO) Satellite Congresses. He has been the chief organiser for APAO Satellite Congresses in Vietnam, Mongolia, Iran, and Cambodia. Prof Chan is the Secretary of the APAO Congress Committee for the annual APAO Congress, which is typically attended by over 6,000 delegates. In 2026, he successfully led the Australian bid for the APAO Congress to come to Sydney in 2030. In 2015, he received the APAO Achievement Award for his scientific contributions.

Prof Chan is a Board Member of SEE Together, a charity devoted to giving people in remote Mongolian communities better access to basic eye care. From 2008–2018, he was actively involved in fundraising for The Eye Foundation and then became an advisory committee member from 2016–2018. Prof Chan also sits on several pharmaceutical advisory boards and donates his honoraria to various charities such as The Eye Foundation, Australian College of Optometry, Red Cross Australia, and Eyes for Everest. He is also a Board Member of the Australian Society of Ophthalmologists.

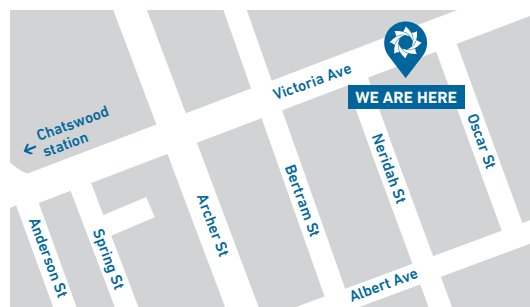

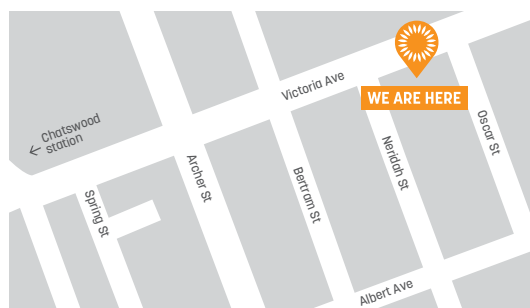
